## Presbyterian Women's Symbol

### ***Forgiven and freed by God in Jesus Christ,***

Forgiven and freed by grace through faith, the central figure stands in praise. ***and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves:***

Rooted in faith, the trio of women emerges. The outline of the central figure forms a cross. We are Presbyterian women engrafted in Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. It is no longer we who live, but Christ who lives in us.

### ***to nurture our faith through prayer and Bible study,***

The right figure holds a book to guide her reading, studying, praying, or meditating.

### ***to support the mission of the church worldwide***

The left figure reaches out to care for others, as she shares, nurtures, and heals. The circle represents the church worldwide where women offer their gifts and talents in the midst of the global community.

### ***to work for justice and peace,***

The uplifted arms of the central figure reach out to embrace a just peace. The relationship between the three figures depicts lives of wholeness rather than turmoil.

### ***and to build an inclusive, caring, community of women***

The three women have no distinct features. They represent all women. The shapes surrounding them express energy, strength, and openness.

### ***that strengthens the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)***

Our name, Presbyterian Women, ties us to our denomination. The Bible resembles the Bible depicted in the PC (USA) Seal.

### ***and witnesses to the promises of God's kingdom.***

Guided by the Purpose, Presbyterian Women witnesses to the reality of God's present realm.

*The Book of Order states, "Insofar as Christ's will for the church is set forth in scripture, it is to be obeyed". (G-1.0100c) The symbol of the Bible therefore represents the word, **Jesus Christ**, the foundation of our freedom, and the women coming out of it show we are freed by our faith.*

## **PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN OFFERINGS**

### **BIRTHDAY OFFERING**

In 1922, ten years after the Women's Auxiliary of the Presbyterian Church in the United States (PCUS) was formed, the women sought an appropriate way to celebrate what the Auxiliary had meant to them. Mrs. Hallie Paxon Winsborough, Superintendent of Women's Work, touring mission stations in the Orient, visited Miss Dowd's School for Girls in Kochi, Japan. She saw inadequate facilities and crowded rooms and recognized a need which could be met by Presbyterian Women in the United States. Returning home, she challenged all the women of the church to give only one penny (or one dollar) for each year of their lives as a "Birthday Gift" to those school girls in Japan. This offering is collected in May each year. Throughout the world, the church has health care facilities, hospitals, clinics and nursing services that continually need funds.

### **THANK OFFERING**

This special offering gives us the opportunity to say "Thank You, Lord" for blessings we have received daily and to allow us to show our appreciation by giving to those less fortunate. Forty percent of this offering will be used to support medical missions throughout the world. The balance of funds generated will be used for new creative areas of mission, undesignated in advance. Specific projects will be selected by the Creative Ministries Offering Committee from project proposals submitted. This offering will be received in November each year.

### **COLUMBIA FRIENDSHIP CIRCLE**

Columbia Friendship Circle is an organization of women in local churches who are concerned about the training of ministers, missionaries, and directors of Christian education. Concern is expressed through prayer and financial support.

### **MISSION OPPORTUNITIES**

There are many needs such as sewing articles for use in partner countries, sewing articles for use in the Georgetown area, purchasing and assembling kits for use in the USA and making contributions for designated needs. Gifts given through Presbyterian Women Mission Opportunities fill needs that are not being met in any other way.

### **THORNWELL HOME FOR CHILDREN**

Located in Clinton, South Carolina, this ministry of our church provides for children in need, including their education in the context of its own school system.

### **LEAST COIN CIRCLE OF PRAYER AND FELLOWSHIP**

This is a worldwide movement of individual prayer and giving begun in 1956 by Shanti Solomon of India. Women from 70 countries express oneness in Christ by a common gift – their least coin – to a special project of relief-reconciliation, and evangelism. The projects are

determined by an international committee administered by the Asian Church Women's Conference. The meaning of the gift is found in its spirit and not in the material results.

## **BYLAWS FOR GEORGETOWN PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN**

### **ARTICLE I – NAME**

The name of this organization shall be Presbyterian Women in the Georgetown Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

### **ARTICLE II – PURPOSE**

Forgiven and freed by God in Jesus Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves to:

- nurture our faith through prayer and Bible study;
- support the mission of the church worldwide;
- work for justice and peace;
- build an inclusive, caring community of women that strengthens the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and witnesses to the promise of God's kingdom.

Presbyterian Women in Georgetown strives to make a positive difference in the lives of others in our community and throughout the world and pledges to be “joyful in hope, patient in affliction and faithful in prayer.” (Romans 12:12)

### **ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP**

Membership in Presbyterian Women(PW) is open to all women. Presbyterian Women members are those who choose to participate in or be supportive of Presbyterian Women in any way.

Active members meet in circles once a month from September through May for Bible study, a program, and fellowship. Associate and inactive members participate as they desire.

All Presbyterian women are urged to practice their faith by showing love and caring concern for each other and by participating in Christian service in our church and the community.

### **ARTICLE IV – GATHERINGS**

PW in the Congregation may meet for fellowship, inspiration, information, advocacy, at any time with appropriate notice to all Circle leaders. Presbyterian Women shall meet at least once a year in the Spring for the election of officers and other matters requiring approval or attention of all members. This date will coincide with the Birthday Luncheon unless otherwise determined by the Coordinating Team. If a different date and time is scheduled, appropriate notice shall be given to all Circle Leaders one month prior to the meeting.

### **ARTICLE V - COORDINATING TEAM ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE**

Section 1. A Coordinating Team comprising elected officers and Circle Leaders shall conduct the business of Presbyterian Women in the Congregation. Additionally, members –at-large with specific responsibilities may be appointed by the Moderator. Leaders shall work to fulfill the Purpose and Principles of Presbyterian Women.

Section 2. The elected members of the Coordinating Team shall be the Moderator/Historian, Vice-Moderator, Secretary/Treasurer and Search Chair Person.

- Section 3. The Moderator of the Search Committee shall present the names of women to be elected to the currently serving Coordinating Team for approval at least one month prior to the Spring meeting. The slate of officers will be elected and installed at the Spring meeting.
- Section 4. The term of office shall be for two years, with the privilege of being reelected for another term or until a successor has been duly elected and installed..

## **ARTICLES VI - DUTIES OF LEADERS**

- Section 1. The Moderator shall preside at all meetings of the Coordinating Team and at all gatherings of PW in the Congregation. She will be the key person to receive communications on behalf of the organization and shall be the direct link to PW in the Presbytery.
- Section 2. The Vice-Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator, or at her request. If the office of Moderator becomes vacant between elections, she shall complete the Moderator's term. She shall assist the Moderator as requested.
- Section 3. The Secretary shall maintain and preserve the working records of PW in the congregation.
- Section 4. The Historian shall maintain and preserve the historical records of PW in the Congregation.
- Section 5. The Treasurer shall have knowledge and understanding of all procedures regarding the receipts and disbursements of the operating funds of PW in the Congregation. She shall receive and send to the Treasurer of PW in the Presbytery the funds received for Mission Pledge and Creative Ministries. She shall make a quarterly financial report available to the Session of the church.
- Section 6. The Moderator of the Search Committee shall chair the Search Committee composed of at least three members of PW and present for election the names of women nominated for leadership positions to PW in the Congregation.
- Section 7. The circle leaders shall bring their circles' needs and concerns to the Coordinating Team and in turn report back to their circles.

## **ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF THE COORDINATING TEAM**

The Coordinating Team shall:

- conduct an annual review and evaluation based on goals of the year just completed;
- set goals and objectives for the new program year;
- discover and utilize the gifts of members;
- develop an ongoing educational program for women based on their spiritual needs;
- provide an opportunity to support the mission of the PC (U.S.A.) through giving, education, global awareness;
- prepare a quarterly report presented to Session;
- maintain an ongoing, working relationship with the PW Cluster Leader;
- maintain relations with PW in the Presbytery and facilitate communication of information and resources from/to PW at all levels of the wider church;
- relate to any other women's groups that may exist in the Congregation; maintain relationships with Church Women United and with other ecumenical groups, community and issue networks, as appropriate.

## **ARTICLE VIII - SEARCH COMMITTEE**

The Search Committee shall consist of the Moderator and at least three members of PW in the Congregation who are appointed by the Coordinating Team with consideration given to diverse representation by all the Circles. The responsibility of the committee shall be to recommend persons to be called to leadership positions in PW in the Congregation.

## **ARTICLE IX - FINANCES**

The program of Presbyterian Women in the Congregation is financed by supporting the Celebration of Mission through Women's pledges. Each Woman is encouraged to pledge through Presbyterian Women in the Congregation for:

- Women's support for the mission of the church worldwide.
- Basic operating budgets of Presbyterian Women at the congregation, Presbytery, Synod and churchwide.

Presbyterian Women in the Congregation supports the operating budget of, Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery, and Presbyterian Women in the Synod, by sending the recommended amount to the treasurer of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery.

## **ARTICLE X - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY**

The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern PW in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) in all cases to which they are applicable and to which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws and the Constitution of the PC (U.S.A.).

## **ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS**

These Bylaws may be amended at any annual gathering by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting, provided notice of the proposed amendments has been submitted, in writing, to the members at least thirty (30) days prior to the gathering at which they will be voted on. They may also be amended by a three-fourths vote without prior notice. These Bylaws may be suspended by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting, provided notice of such suspension has been submitted in writing to the members thirty (30) days prior to the gathering at which it will be voted on.
